

Mystery Priest, Guardian Angel or Bible Prophecy

By now you have probably heard of that amazing story out of Missouri, where a girl was in a very serious car accident, but at the very critical moment when her vital signs were declining, a Catholic priest showed up and blessed her with holy oil, whereupon the neighbouring Fire Department came with the 'jaws of life' and extricated her and safely got her to a nearby hospital, and I guess she is doing alright at the moment, although she has a lot of broken bones.

The amazing part of the story is that those who attended her at this time believe that the priest was actually a guardian angel, because after the accident when they tried to thank him, he was nowhere to be found, even though the highway was completely blocked off. The amazing thing is that the girl herself had asked the first responders, who were trying to extricate her from this terrible car crash, to pray, and it was at that moment that the priest arrived. He anointed her with holy oil, told her and the group to remain calm, and that the tools would now work. At that moment a neighbouring Fire Department came with the 'jaws of life' and succeeded to remove the girl, and get her to a hospital.

Whenever I see an amazing story like this, it immediately strikes me, is this prophetic? For example, we know that one of the three groups who will be preserved from the Antichrist are the remnant Catholics. The Catholic priest would seem to indicate that this is about Catholicism. The name of the girl saved was Katie Lentz. Now does Katie Lentz symbolize Catholics? You might say that's a bit of a stretch, but certainly Katie Lentz does not sound like Baptist or Methodist or Episcopal or Lutheran. If Katie Lentz stands for any religious denomination, it would be the Catholics.

Or how about the driver of the car that struck Katie Lentz? Would he represent the Antichrist? Well, it's interesting that his name is Aaron Smith. Both the Antichrist and Aaron Smith begin with the letter A; perhaps a bit of a stretch, but then again, it's only a one in 26 chance that would occur. But the real clincher is that the Catholic priest used holy oil to anoint the girl. That is a reference to Daniel, chapters 10 and 12, which tell about the False Prophet, who afflicts the Catholics but who is not anointed.

I have done a whole series on the 'Abomination of Desolation' as found in Daniel, and I would like to review it one more time, because I think this accident is pointing to where Daniel warns the remnant Catholics about the False Prophet. Chapters 10 and chapter 12 of Daniel are actually the same chapter, and the verses in chapter 10 explain the verses in chapter 12 when the two chapters are arranged in a chiasm; in other words, verse number 3 of chapter 10, lines up with verse number 11 of chapter 12, and in chapter 12, Daniel talks about the continual sacrifice being taken away, the 'Abomination of Desolation' being set up, and a length of time of 1290 days, and all this is explained in chapter 10, verse number 3.

The 'continual sacrifice' in chapter 12:11 is the 'desirable bread' and 'flesh and wine' in chapter 10:3, in other words, the Holy Eucharist, and it is taken away by the False Prophet. And Daniel adds '**neither was I anointed with oil**', in other words the False Prophet is not anointed with holy oil, and is that the reference to this accident in Missouri? The priest represents a good pope, not the False Prophet, and this length of time of three weeks that Daniel speaks about is actually the length of time of the Great Tribulation. It corresponds with 1290 days as mentioned in verse number 11 of chapter 12.

But is this incident telling us, that the true pope, Petrus Romanus, will be in the spirit, like an angel, as by the way, Maria Divine Mercy suggests. And that would mean that neither Pope Francis nor Pope Benedict are the End Times pope of Saint Malachy's prophecies. Now, I'm not saying Pope Francis is not a true pope, because he could be. The False Prophet must perform several specific duties to fulfill his role, and so far Pope Francis has not done any of those things. So I am not saying one way or another about Pope Francis.

In conclusion, this story is continuing to make headlines, and who knows, maybe they will find the priest. So far, they have examined all the photographs taken at the scene and there is no priest in any of them. I suspect this is a divine intervention, and a divine prophecy.
