

Mary's Immaculate Conception and Bible Prophecy

I'm doing this program on December 8th, which is the Feast of the Immaculate Conception, and that is when we honor Mary, because she was conceived without original sin, and in fact, she lived her entire life without committing any sin. She was unique among all humans in that respect, and in our battle against the Antichrist, this is important to understand, because although Jesus is our commander in chief, don't forget, Mary is His five star general.

Several months ago on YouTube, there was a debate about the Immaculate Conception. Keith Truth took the position that this doctrine was false and Bengali1 took the Catholic view, and that is, that Mary indeed was created without original sin. Now when I commented on Keith Truth's first video, and pointed out an error, he blocked me from making any further comments.

Here is my response to Keith's video, for which he blocked me. You are in error when you say 'God my Saviour' is a common phrase in Scripture. Mary is the ONLY person to say 'God my Saviour'. OUR Saviour is common, but not MY Saviour. Notice Mary does not say 'Jesus my Saviour', even though Jesus is in her womb. That's because Mary was sinless and did not require His sacrifice.

It's important for us to understand, that although Jesus is the Saviour for all the rest of us, because we are sinners, God as a Trinity is the saviour for Mary. That's why she says God my Saviour, instead of Jesus my Saviour. Just as the phrase 'blessed among women' is unique to Mary, so also is the phrase, God my Saviour. But here is Keith's response.

Keith responded to my comment. 'Check your Bible again my friend because in 2 Samuel 22:3 'God... my Saviour' is said. But Keith is being very deceptive, because these two little dots here represent 24 words, a colon, a semicolon, and two commas. This phrase 'God my Saviour' is not found in Samuel, and I don't know why Keith calls me, 'my friend', because immediately after he posted this response, he blocked me. If you can leave out 24 words, one colon, one semicolon and two commas from any two particular verses in the Bible, you can get any quote you want from the Bible, but now here are Mary's exact words.

Luke chapter 1 verses 46 and 47. 'And Mary said, My soul magnifies the Lord, And my spirit has rejoiced in God my Saviour.' Notice there are no dots which indicate missing words or colons or semicolons in this phrase of Mary. Mary says God my Saviour, and the reason is because Jesus did not have to die for Mary's sins. Mary was sinless. She was immaculately conceived. Jesus died and suffered and shed His blood for the rest of us; not God the Father; not God the Holy Spirit.

That's why when Jesus says, 'my God, my God why have you forsaken me?' He is referring to the other two persons of the Divine Trinity. They did not suffer and die on the cross. That was Jesus fate only, and therefore when Mary says God my Saviour, she is not saying that Jesus suffered and died for her.

So why does Mary say God my Saviour if God does not save her from sin? And in the very next biblical passage, we realize that it is not sin which God saves Mary from. Luke 1:48 'For he has looked upon the lowliness of his handmaid: for behold from henceforth all generations shall call me blessed.' Notice that God as a Trinity, does not save Mary from sin, anywhere in this passage. He saves her from the ignominy of obscurity. For from henceforth all generations shall call Mary blessed.

Mary is the woman in Genesis 3:15 who is destined to crush the head of the serpent. As I said before, Jesus is our commander in chief in this battle against the Antichrist, but Mary is His five star general. Those who like to say that only Jesus will be victorious in this battle against the Antichrist, like to point out to me a passage from 2Thessalonians.

Let's look at what St. Paul says. **2 Thess 2:8 'And then shall that lawless one be revealed,'** now this 'lawless one' is the Antichrist **whom the Lord Jesus shall kill with the spirit of his mouth, and shall destroy with the brightness of his coming:'** Notice 'Jesus will kill the Antichrist with the spirit of his mouth and with the brightness of his coming'. These are his two weapons; the spirit and the brightness.

But what does the spirit of his mouth, and the brightness of his coming signify? Notice the duality. This is very similar to the two edged sword which comes out of Jesus mouth. That is also symbolic. Those two sides of the sword symbolize Mary's rosary and scapular. Those are Jesus' weapons with which he uses to defeat the Antichrist. Now the brightness of his coming is a visual sign, and that refers to Mary's

scapular. The spirit of his mouth is an audible sign and that symbolizes prayer, specifically Mary's rosary.

Now we see this same duality in the fight between David and Goliath, which all Bible scholars will tell you symbolizes the End Times battle between Jesus and the Antichrist.

1 Sam 14:47 Now this is David shouting out to Goliath. **'And all this assembly shall know that the LORD saves not with sword and spear: for the battle is the LORD's and He will give you into our hands.'**

Now the question is, if the Lord saves not with sword and spear, what does he save with? From this passage, it ought to be obvious, that to defeat the Antichrist, we cannot count on hiding guns or hardened gold. This is a spiritual battle as St. Paul says. We are battling powers and principalities. The two weapons which Jesus uses are Mary's rosary and scapular.

1 Sam 17:50 **'So David prevailed over the Philistine with a sling and with a stone and smote the Philistine and slew him; but there was no sword in the hand of David.'**

But what does this stone signify? Remember David chose five smooth pebbles. Those five smooth pebbles symbolize Mary's rosary. This sling symbolized Mary's scapular, just as David symbolizes Jesus and the Philistine Goliath symbolizes the Antichrist.

Although Mary was conceived without sin she is not the only one. Adam and Eve were also conceived without sin. However they fell. Mary's perfection shows that Adam and Eve were guilty, as are the rest of us. We must do what Jesus said, and that is be perfect, even as our Father in Heaven is perfect, if we expect to defeat the Antichrist.
