

Marian Dogma Catholic vs Protestant

On this program I want to talk about the five titles of the Blessed Virgin Mary, because this is very important in the End Times. As you know, in our battle against the Antichrist, Jesus is the Commander in chief, but don't forget, Mary is his five star general, and the two weapons Jesus will use, to defeat the Antichrist, are Mary's rosary and her scapular.

And on this program I want to look at the five titles of Mary, to show you why she has been given the honor of defeating the Antichrist. Her first title is **Mother of God**. Her second title is the **Immaculate Conception**. Her third title is that she is **Ever Virgin**. Her fourth title is that she is **Queen of Heaven**, that is the assumption, and lastly that she is **Co-Redemptrix** of mankind.

Now recently I've been listening on YouTube, to debates between Protestants and Catholics. And in general, Protestants tend to degrade Mary, and Catholics tend to give her more honor than is really due her. Now Catholics and Protestants have been arguing about these titles forever it seems, and I think you need to realize, that you must fight together, because we have a common enemy. The Antichrist will defeat us if we do not get our act together.

Now on some of these titles I agree with the Protestants, and some I agree with the Catholics. Let's take her first title, Mother of God. This is misleading, and I agree with that. The reason is, Mary is not the mother of God as a Trinity. In other words Mary is not the mother of God, the Father. She is not the mother of God, the Holy Spirit. She is the mother of Jesus. I believe, in this case, Protestants are correct to insist in a proper title for Mary. She can be called the mother of Jesus, or even better, we can call her what Elizabeth called her, and that is, the mother of my Lord.

On the other hand, Protestants must follow the same rule, when Catholics declare that Mary is sinless. How do we know that Mary is sinless? Because she did not need a Saviour. If you go by the Bible, you know that Mary said 'God is my Saviour'. Now if you say that Mary cannot be the mother of God, because God is a Trinity, and you are correct, then you also must acknowledge that since God is Mary's Saviour, Jesus is not her Saviour. Jesus died on the cross for all the rest of us. Remember God the Father, and God the Holy Spirit did not shed their blood on the cross. Remember the words of Jesus. He said, 'my God, my God, why have you forsaken me?' He says my God, my

God, because he is addressing the other two persons of the Trinity, that is, my God the Father, and my God the Holy Spirit.

Now the reason Mary does not need Jesus as her Saviour, is because she never sinned, and in Luke 1:48, we find what it is, that God saves Mary from, and it is not from her sin.

Mary says, where he has regarded the lowliness of his handmaiden. In other words, God has seen that Mary is so humble, that she will never tell people that she is the greatest woman God ever created.

Remember God Himself gives Mary the title, 'blessed among women', through the Archangel Gabriel. So God does not save Mary from sin. He saves her from the ignominy of obscurity. 'For from henceforth, all generations shall call me blessed.'

Now I know some people object and say, well Mary had to offer a sin offering following Jesus birth. She offered pigeons in the temple, but that was merely to avoid scandal. Jesus did the same thing when He paid the temple tax. As He told his apostles, the Son does not need to pay the temple tax, but He did anyway in order to avoid scandal; the same with Mary. That's the only reason she offered sin offering in the temple.

Now her third title is that she is Ever Virgin. Well Mary herself says this. When the angel says that she is going to have a child, she says how can this happen? I do not know man. When she says 'I do not know man', she is declaring her vow of celibacy. She is declaring that she will be forever a virgin. Now this is simply common sense.

Let's say you are a woman who is engaged, and an angel tells you that you are about to have a child. What would your reaction be? You might ask, well will this child be a boy or a girl? What will he or she be like? The last thing you would say is, how can this ever be? I do not know man. That's because you would assume, and rightly so, that you and your husband would have a child. But Mary knows that she and Joseph are not going to have any children. That's why Mary says, I do not know man. She is planning on being forever a virgin. Now some people object, and say that Jesus had brothers and sisters. The term brothers and sisters in the Bible, does not necessarily mean a blood relative. Brothers and sisters could be cousins, or even close friends. People of the same tribe in the Bible are called brothers and sisters.

Now Mary's fourth title is Queen of Heaven, and this is right out of the book of Revelation. Saint John sees Mary in heaven with a crown of twelve stars on her head. Now Mary is in heaven. She is wearing a crown. It is only logical to say that Mary, is therefore, Queen of Heaven. How can this be anyone else, when Saint John says that her Son will rule mankind with a rod of iron? This can only be Mary. Now some people say, well this could be Israel, but all you had to do is read a little further on, and you realize that her seed has the testimony of Jesus Christ. Therefore this woman cannot possibly be Israel.

Now in the End Times, when Elijah returns, he will convert 144,000 Jews. This is the remnant of Israel. They will indeed have the testimony of Jesus Christ, but remember St. John sees this woman in heaven 2,000 years ago. She is wearing a crown. She must be the Queen of Heaven, and she can only be Mary.

Now Mary's last title is Co-Redemptrix. Now here I do object somewhat to the term, just as I did not care for the term mother of God, because Mary is the mother of Jesus. The word 'co' in this case is confusing, because sometimes it means a subordinate such as a co-pilot, but it also can mean an equal, as co-worker. Mary is not the equal of Jesus, but on the other hand, the plane cannot get off the ground without the co-pilot, and neither can redemption occur without the ascent of Mary.

That is why Mary is Co-Redemptrix, and one of the requirements of being a Redeemer of mankind, is that you must suffer, and Mary did indeed suffer for humanity. The Bible says clearly that Mary will suffer a wound in her heart. Your heart shall be pierced with a sword as Saint Simeon tells her. Certainly watching her son die on a cross was heart-wrenching, and even in these End Times, remember Mary is going to be wounded in her heel. She will crush Satan's head, but he will strike at her heel, and as I have explained on other programs, especially my program, 'Fourth Prophecy'.

So as you can see, sometimes I agree with the Catholic terminology, and sometimes I agree with the Protestants. Mother of God is not accurate. Co-Redemptrix also needs to be explained, but the fact is that Mary does merit five titles. She is the mother of my Lord. She is Ever Sinless. She was assumed into Heaven. She was Ever Virgin and she is Co-Redemptrix of mankind.
