May 4, 2016 (LifeSiteNews) – The head of the Vatican's Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith, considered second only to the pope as the

Cardinal Gerhard Müller, who is the second in command, so to speak, in the Vatican, especially as far as doctrinal matters go, has finally responded to Pope Francis' apostolic exhortation, Amoris Laetitia. And the news is not good for the False Prophet. I think he is going to have

to respond to what Cardinal Müller says. And I will just give you a very brief synopsis of this, and this is dated today, May 4th, 2:20 this afternoon, that's in the Western time, it's 12:20 Eastern time; "The head of the Vatican's Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith, considered second only to the Pope as the Vatican's authority on doctrinal matters, has responded to the question of whether Pope Francis' recent exhortation, Amoris Laetitia, has opened the door to giving Communion to divorced and remarried Catholics. Cardinal Gerhard Müller's response is unambiguous:" (Pope Francis won't like that at all) "the Church's teaching cannot be changed, and the exhortation did not do so."

Here is the secondary headline. I think you can see that at the top. "The clarification from Cardinal Müller on the much-debated footnote, 351," (the opposite of the Rosary 153) "is likely to be the highest-level clarification to come out of the Vatican. When Pope Francis was recently asked about the footnote by journalists, he said he did not remember it, nor what it said". That is really hard to believe, and this isn't evidently the only thing Cardinal Müller has stated.

The "Die Tagespost reports that Müller also addressed the question of Communion for the divorced and remarried elsewhere, again unambiguously reaffirming the traditional Church teaching." (Now this is very interesting.) "The principle is that no one can really want to receive a Sacrament - the Eucharist - without having at the same time the will to live according to the other Sacraments, among them the Sacrament of Marriage. Whoever lives in a way that contradicts the marital bond opposes the visible sign of the Sacrament of Marriage." and, "If the Church were to admit such a person to Holy Communion, she would then be committing that act which Thomas Aquinas calls 'a falseness in the sacred sacramental signs.'"

Well, thank you Cardinal Müller. I am afraid your clarification won't hold

much water with the dissident bishops. For example, here in the Chicago Archdiocese, Archbishop Cupich has said that ANYONE can receive Communion in his archdiocese. You people in Chicago, you have got to pin your priests down. They have got to deny this, otherwise their consecrations will not be valid.

However, because Pope Benedict has not yet stated his opposition to this, maybe your communions will be valid. It's in a state of flux right now, so I don't like to discourage you from going to Communion. I think that we have to pay attention. I think Pope Francis is going to have to respond to Cardinal Müller's statement.

Other Cardinals, for example, Cardinal Kasper, they have said that Amoris Laetita does allow Communion for divorced and remarried. As I said, that will make all consecrations in the Catholic Church invalid, because it will falsify the intent of the priests. So, that's breaking news for today. I just wanted to keep you up to date on that.
