

Pope Washes Women...AGAIN!

Today, we celebrate the greatest of all the feast days on the Christian calendar and that is when Jesus rose from the dead. And he rose to give all of us hope of our own eternal salvation; however, in addition to this good news, I also have some not so good news. And that is because Pope Francis again made the error this week of washing the feet of women during his Holy Thursday penitential service.

That is totally unbiblical. Jesus never washed the feet of women and this is very serious. And a week or so ago, the seer in Ireland, called 'Maria Divine Mercy', predicted that Pope Francis, and she considers him the False Prophet, and let me tell you what she wrote. She said, and she's quoting Jesus, **'You will know these traitors by their symbolic gestures which insult my divinity.'** So that's an interesting way to express it. What Pope Francis did by washing the feet of women was to insult Jesus. What he is saying is *'I am superior to my own Lord and Saviour, Jesus did not wash the feet of women because he was constrained by the culture of that time which did not consider women equal to men; but now, we live in a superior enlightened culture where women are superior to men,'* and that is a very grave mistake on his part.

Here is what the Pope is doing. He is not only perverting what Jesus did, he is contradicting the words of Peter and Paul. Here is what Paul wrote in Ephesians: **'Wives, submit yourselves to your own husbands as to the Lord for the husband is the head of the wife, even as Christ is the head of the Church. Therefore as the Church is subject to Christ, so also let the wives be to their husbands in all things.'**

And Peter says very much the same thing: **'In like manner also let wives be subject to their husbands.'** And Pope Francis is contradicting what Peter and Paul are saying and he is contradicting them in a very subtle manner. And I am here to warn you wives today: do not listen to what Pope Francis is saying. You must still be subject to your husbands. In other words, you do not have the authority to tell your husbands, *'now it's your turn to wash my feet'*. If you say; *'you can now be subject to me'* that is a very false interpretation of the Gospel.

Let me read to you John's account of Jesus washing the feet of his disciples because as Jesus said, this is an example but NOT an

example of men subjecting themselves to women. **'After that he poured water into a basin,** (this is John chapter 13, verse 5, and he's talking about Jesus at the Last Supper) **and began to wash his disciples' feet and to wipe them with the towel with which he was girded. Then comes he to Simon Peter and Peter said to him, 'Lord do you wash my feet?' Jesus answered and said to him, 'What I do you know not now but you shall know hereafter.'** Peter said to him, **'You shall never wash my feet.'** Jesus answered him, **'If I wash you not you have no part with me.'** And then Jesus goes on to explain his actions, 'Then after he had washed their feet and taken his garments being set down again he said to them, **'Know you what I have done for you. You call me master and Lord and you say well for so I am. If then I being your Lord and Master have washed your feet you also ought to wash one another's feet for I have given you an example.'** Note this example: the example is not that men should now be subject to their wives, **'That as I have done to you so you do also. Amen, Amen, I say to you, the servant is not greater than his Lord neither is the apostle greater than he that sent him.'**

And so in conclusion, maybe my message today on Easter is not that negative. I am simply upholding the Gospel, the words and actions of our Lord. And let us all pray that Pope Francis sees the error of his ways. Maybe next year he will act in accordance with the Gospel.
