

Is Pope Francis 'Petrus Romanus' or the False Prophet?

This will be a follow up to my last program about Pope Francis and you wouldn't believe the amount of flack I have been taking for that program. And first of all, let me make it very, very clear: I do not support the Pope's position that the Catholic Church has been speaking out too much against abortion, gay marriage, or contraception. In fact, just the opposite.

I don't believe the Church speaks out enough against those evils and I want to give you a personal example. I've been attending Mass for almost 75 years. Even in my wildest college days I never missed Sunday Mass and I often went to daily Mass. In all that time, I have only heard a priest once give a sermon against contraception. And the reason I remember that so well is because people actually walked out on his sermon. I couldn't believe it. I have never seen that happen before or since.

Now admittedly, that was 30 years ago, but just last night I watched a video on YouTube by Michael Voris, I believe he calls his program 'The Vortex', and he mentioned that if you go to the official website of the National Conference of Catholic Bishops, that's here in the United States, you won't find one word on the entire website against contraception. You'll find a ton of material about environmental issues. So where is all this emphasis which Pope Francis is complaining about?

Of course, we need to remember, this is the United States. Pope Francis comes from an entirely different background. The poor in South America have to worry about getting enough food to eat. Here in America, we live in the lap of luxury. I challenge you, go to any Walmart or Family Dollar or Dollar General or any discount store and just take a look at the people standing in front of you in the checkout line. The problem with the poor in America is not hunger: their problem is obesity!

So I think when you are judging Pope Francis you have to look at his cultural background. Where he comes from, poverty is a bigger problem than these sexual issues; and what I want to talk about on this program is whether Pope Francis is a good Pope, that is Petrus Romanus of the End Times, or a bad Pope, and that would be the False Prophet. And for me, the jury is still out on that.

Now, I have criticized Pope Francis for his errors in the past, for example, when he carried that perverted cross at Lampedusa: he processed both into the Mass and he left the Mass with that yin yang type of cross. I also criticized the Pope when he washed women's feet during Holy Week this past Spring. Jesus never washed the feet of women. On the other hand, I sincerely praised Pope Francis when he held that worldwide prayer vigil in the Vatican for peace in Syria. Less than 24 hours later, President Obama backed off on his plans to bomb Syria. Putin and Assad agreed to destroy Syria's chemical weapons, but nowhere did the media give the Pope any credit. The media fell all over themselves praising him for what appeared to be Pope Francis' acceptance of gay marriage, contraception, and abortion but they never once mentioned that prayer vigil which I believe was really the dramatic turning point in the Syria crisis. I believe Pope Francis prevented nuclear war.

And lastly I want to point out that in Scripture there are certain prophecies which the False Prophet must fulfill and so far Pope Francis has not done any of these. The most important is that the False Prophet will take away the Daily Sacrifice from the Prince, as Daniel puts it. That means that he will ban the Eucharist throughout Christianity, not just Catholic churches.

Let's take a look at what Daniel says in chapter 10, verse number 3, because this is an End Times prophecy about the False Prophet: **'I ate no desirable bread,'** that 'desirable bread' is the Eucharist, **'and neither flesh nor wine entered into my mouth,'** again, that is the Body and Blood of Christ, **'neither did I anoint myself with oil,'** that refers to the False Prophet: he will be a False Pope because He will not be truly anointed. This means he could be a Cardinal or he could be Pope Francis who may not be considered truly anointed because we still have Pope Benedict. Pope Benedict was forced out of the Vatican. Remember, that's why the lightning struck the Vatican at exactly 5:55 the same day the Pope resigned. That was not an accident. **'...til three whole weeks were fulfilled.'** Those 'three whole weeks' are 21 days and it refers to the three years of the Great Tribulation. It is during the Great Tribulation that we will not have a true Eucharist in the Catholic Church or anywhere else throughout Christianity.

And so in conclusion, I want to admit my own shortcomings: I am only a Co-Prophet, I do not receive visions or dreams or locutions or messages from Our Lord or Our Lady. I look at Scripture and I can see what is coming and in fact I ask your help. Please help me keep informed on whatever you see because the moment that the Holy Eucharist is taken away from the Prince, who is Christ, that is the time we will know that the Abomination of Desolation has come, the first AOD that Daniel prophesies about, and that is the time when we, especially as Catholics, must flee our Church. But remember, we cannot flee before that time either.
